## Commuter to office hated by workers

Commuting to work is Britain's top pet hate according to a new study of office workers.

Other pet hates in the office include politics and gossip, according to the survey by Remote Employment.

Brits do not like working in an office because of their dreary commute each day, which brought in the highest pet hate vote of 39.25 per cent.

Most drivers said they would like to change their drive to work habits.

Next on the Pet Hate Survey was politics and office gossip with almost 33 per cent, while too many interruptions voted in at 13.46 per cent and expensive lunches only took 1.42 per cent.

Some 13 per cent of the people surveyed said that their pet hate was their boss.

Responding to the poll results, Paula Wynne, Director of Remote Employment said: "The results of this survey show that the traditional office work culture is waking up to new ways of working.

"Remote working is a perfect way to maintain or increase business production and an employee's quality work life, while keeping costs down."

The survey suggests that flexible working and working from home is a positive and productive trend.

More and more call centres, service agencies, and forward thinking organisations across the UK are considering flexible and work from home options or they are outsourcing their office functions and projects to freelancers.
